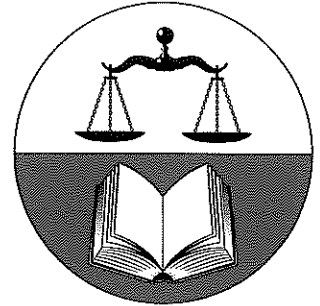

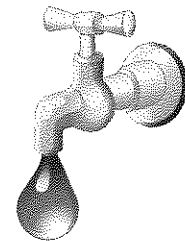


Welcome to Social Studies 11 Explorations! This is a new Ministry of Education course that gives you an opportunity to 'explore' a variety of Social Studies senior elective course offerings while still covering the Curricular and Core Competencies. In this course you will be learning to use Social Studies inquiry processes and skills to ask questions, gather, interpret, and analyze ideas, and communicate findings and decisions about our world and our shared history. You will also be expected to do the following:

- *Assess the credibility and justifiability of evidence, data, and interpretations*
- *Compare and contrast continuities and changes, trends, and patterns for different people, places, events, phenomena, and developments.*
- *Assess the short and long-term causes and expected consequences of people's actions, events, phenomena, ideas and developments.*
- *Infer and explain different perspectives on people, places, events, phenomena,, ideas and developments.*
- *Make reasoned and ethical judgements about people, places, events, phenomena, ideas and developments and determine appropriate ways to respond.*

Some course areas we will be examining this year include:

- **Comparative Cultures 12**
 - Ancient History including Egypt, Greece, Rome, Mayan
- **History 12**
 - World War I, Interwar Period, WWII, Intro to Cold War
- **Geography 12**
 - Earth, Fresh Water resources, World Oceans, Climate Change



As we go through these areas of exploration, we will also be examining philosophical beliefs, the psychological principles that connect, the laws and social justice related issues, and the politics at play. This course is designed to have some flexibility of content, while opening up as many social studies related areas of learning for you.

Textbooks:

Due to the variety of topics covered, textbooks will be signed out for the durations of our units.

Attendance & Lates:
